# 2022 Speed Limit Survey

- In August 2022 we went to the public seeking feedback on the recent speed limit changes. We received 46 Responses.

Questions asked were as follows:

1. Do you support further review of Westland District Speed Limit? (Yes/No)
2. Please explain why you feel this way.
3. Are there roads that you would like us to review? (Yes/No)
4. If you answered Yes, please tell us which areas or roads these are.
5. If there are roads or areas that you feel should be reviewed, what speed limits would you consider safe and appropriate in these areas?
6. We'd love to hear your general thoughts and ideas around speed management. What works for you and what doesn't?

# 2022 Speed Limit Survey cont'd

## General Themes:

- 31 Responded Yes for further review, 15 Voted No
- Those who voted “No” generally thought the money would be better invested elsewhere.
- Of those who voted “Yes”
- 10 Favoured further reductions in speeds around the network.
- 4 wanted speed reductions around schools.
- 7 Thought we got it wrong in places.
- 15 Think we need to take a closer Look at Kaniere Road with a mixture on speed limit ranges suggested as alternatives.

## Works Currently Underway

- Cauldron Creek Bridge Replacement (Westroads)
- Resealing of Carriageways (Fulton Hogan)
- Davie Street, Heavy maintenance prior to reseal (Westroads)
- Identification of reseal areas for 2023/24 Season (WDC/Westroads)
- Footpath Renewals and Maintenance programme (footpaths and treatments identified and priced within available budget) Work being planned to get underway early in 2023. (Westroads)
- Bridge inspection programme being developed. (WSP)
- 2022 Transport Survey – Make sure you have your say.

## Projects being scoped and then prepared for Tender

- Haast Jackson Bay Road Pavement Rehab (estimate \$650k)  
Overlay and sealing of section/s between Waiatoto and Arawhata Rivers
- Waitaha Road Localised widening (estimate \$100k)  
Creation of passing opportunities on Waitaha Valley Road
- Haast Jackson Bay Road Resilience Improvements (estimate \$2M)  
Rock protection along Haast Jackson Bay Road near Okuru Lagoon/River Mouth

## Recently Awarded Contracts

- **West Coast Councils Bridge & Structure Asset Management Contract**

Awarded to WSP to administer bridge maintenance and inspection activities for the combined West Coast Councils.  
Helping to identify and develop detailed forward works programmes for significant bridge mtce and renewals as well as end of life replacement analysis.
- **West Coast Councils Regional Asset Management Services Contract**

Awarded to Beca Ltd for Asset Management and Valuation Services  
Key outcomes from this is data improvement, leading the change to combining the West Coast Roding databases into a single database.  
Helping to develop and maintain detailed forward works programmes for reseals, and pavement rehabilitation.  
Asset Revaluation and Fair Value Assessment services for Transportation Assets

## Works Being Investigated/Designed

- Haast Jackson Bay Resilience improvements
- Speed limits around schools (Combined project with Grey & Buller Councils)
- 2023/2024 Reseal programme (initial site identification & investigation)
- Swing gates for repeated flood related road closures on various parts of the network.



## Recent/Ongoing Challenges

- Waitangitahuna River Erosion.



## Recent/Ongoing Challenges

- River aggradation on McCullochs Creek and Snake (Dry) Creek.
